St. Jude Thaddaeus (Feast Day: October 28)

St. Jude, known as Thaddaeus, was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus. Images of St. Jude often include a flame around his head, which represent his presence at Pentecost, when he accepted the Holy Spirit alongside the other apostles. Saint Jude is *not* the same person as Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Our Lord.

There is some debate, though most Biblical scholars agree he was martyred. Following his death, St. Jude's body was brought to Rome. Today his bones can be found in St. Peter's Basilica under the main altar of St. Joseph. We invoke St. Jude when in desperate situations because his New Testament letter stresses that the faithful should persevere in the environment of harsh, difficult circumstances -just as their forefathers had done before them. Two Saints, St. Bridget of Sweden and St. Bernard, had visions from God asking them to accept St. Jude as "The Patron Saint of the Impossible".
